• Last year was officially the busiest of all time for airline passenger traffic at Durango-La Plata County Airport. Total airline traffic was 1.7% higher than in 2019, when the previous record was established, and a remarkable 101% more than passenger traffic in 2020 when the pandemic weighed heavily on demand.

La Plata County Land Use Code Update

• La Plata County will avoid a stall on the rewrite of Chapter 90, oil and gas regulations. The county's natural resources planner left for another opportunity but County Manager Chuck Stevens said the county will continue to move forward with the rewrite. A draft is expected later this year.
